### All-City Art Show Begins During July

Judges for Los Angeles' 9th All-City Outdoor Art Festival, largest of its kind in the country, have been selected to jury the more than 1500 individual works expected to be entered in the show.

The three-day art festival, open to the public without charge, will be held at the Municipal Art Gallery and grounds of Barnsdal Park July 7 through 9, and is sponsored by the Los Angeles Department of Municipal Art.

Kenneth Ross, general manager of the Art Dept., said the judges will be Warren Beach, Director of the Fine Arts Gallery in San Diego, Donald J. Brewer, Director of the Art Center in La Jolla and David W. Scott, Chairman of the Scripps College Art Department.

The judges will select 27 winners out of the four art divisions of painting, watercolor, sculpture and graphics to share a total of \$6,000 in cash prizes and purchase awards which has been donated for the 7th consecutive year by Home Savings and Loan Assn.

## Senior Engineer To Head Program

Theodore L. Mathews of 4142 W. 176th St., Torrance, a senior engineer for Pacific Telephone in Los Angeles, has been named an adviser in the Los Angeles Junior Achievement program.

Junior Achievement is a nationwide program designed primarily to develop the high school student's understanding of the problems encountered in business.

Pacific Telephone is sponsoring two "Junior Achievement companies," one in Burbank and one in Hawthorne.

Mathews will advise a company in Hawthorne.

#### STUDENT PROJECT

Under the program, students form, plan and operate small companies. These companies, usually consisting of between 10 and 15 students, decide upon a product to be manufactured and sold, a firm name, officers and even form a corporation and sell stock.

In their respective companies they carry on all the functions and perform all the duties of a corporate organization. Dividends, if earned, are paid to shareholders who have bought stock at 50 cents per share.

Each of the companies is counseled by a "big brother" adult business concern. A company has three advisers—in the areas of business man-

agement, production and sales—to help the young people in the organization and operation of their corporation.

Mathews, his wife Patricia, and their two children have lived in Torrance for the past eight years.
