### Press Correspondent Finds Egypt Prefers U.S. to Russ

Today, in Amsterdam, I had the experience of talking to an Egyptian consular agent who was on his way to Argentina. After questioning him for a few minutes, he divulged several interesting points of which we are not aware in the U.S.

He claims that we Americans are wrong to assume that the Egyptians prefer the Russian bloc to the Western nations. He said, "We have great admiration for the people of the U.S. We prefer in most cases the point of view held by the Americans."

"As to the Answan Dam," he said, "if the U.S. had helped us we are sure the dam would have been completed by now. The Russians hope to have our dam built in seven years but at the rate we are going I don't think it will be completed on schedule. The Russians are giving us money in dribbles." He then proceeded to laud the American stand on the Suez issue.

Here in Holland and in Belgium a great deal of prosperity exists. The Dutch are reclaiming thousands of acres of land which are now covered by the Zuider Zee. By pumping water and building dikes they are performing wonders. It takes three years after this process for the land to become tillable. This is because the salt must be neutralized. The land, as it is reclaimed, is sold to farmers on a 20-year plan.

From a West German group we met in Amsterdam, one newspaper reporter, we learned that East German and East Berlin refugees are crossing the border at the rate of 40 per hour. This mounting number escaping the Russian dominated part of Germany is caused by the tension lately created by Mr. K.

The people of Holland, and I talked to many of them, feel that the only solution to the German problem is to recognize the existence of two German countries and two cities of Berlin. They prefer this to another war.

### Improvements Set For Two Artesia Cross Streets

County road crews are scheduled to start the improvement of two Artesia boulevard intersections within the next 10 days, it was announced this week by Supervisor Kenneth Hahn's office.

The work will be done at the Boardway and Central avenue approaches to Artesia boulevard and will include reconstruction and widening of the existing shoulders to provide additional roadway width for the intersections to be channeled.

After the widening has been completed, left turn lanes will be provided. This will increase traffic safety for motorists making left turns and also expedite the movement of through traffic.

The project is being carried out under Supervisor Hahn's policy of improving major intersections for the protection and convenience of the motoring public.
