Live moray eels, sharks, octopi, and other denizens of the deep in a 40-aquarium display have been added to the undersea attractions to be featured at the 1961 Pacific Coast Skindiving Show, co-producer Gene Grounds said today.

The show, to be held August 4, 5, 6, at Santa Monica's Civic Auditorium, includes a \$50,000 display of experimental submarines, underwater communications systems, single-engine amphibious aircraft, and the largest assembled collection of latest undersea commercial and sports equipment and devices. Entertainment features will include indoor tank demonstrations, underwater adventure films, the "Miss Skindiver Show" beauty contest, and appearances by water-sports stars Lloyd Bridges, Bill Burrud, Col. John D. Craig, Henry "Buzz" Kulky, Jack Linkletter, "Queen" Zale Parry, and Jeremy Slate, Grounds said.

Mike Loney singled Hamilton home and went to second on the throw to home. Jackie Cowan singled Loney to third. Bill Bergeron walked. Loney scored and Johnny Cairns went to first on a fielders choice. Hons was by a pitch forcing in Cowan for the third run of the inning.

County Urges Skindivers Seek Qualified Courses

"Skin and SCUBA diving in Los Angeles County has risen to new heights of popularity this summer," according to Norman S. Johnson, Director of the County Department of Parks and Recreation. "In the wake of this surge of people participating in the sport, dangers have increased in proportion to the soaring numbers," Johnson added.

All persons interested in taking up skindiving, SCUBA (self contained underwater breathing apparatus) or spearfishing, should seek instruction by a County certified instructor. The County Department of Parks and Recreation conducts an annual instruction class, staffed by experienced divers, where potential instructors are trained in the important roll of teaching others.

Everyone involved in the sport or wishing to learn should check with the Aquatics Section of the County Department of Parks and Recreation, RI 9-0911, to be sure they are receiving instruction from a certified person. LIVES LOST

Two persons lost their lives last week-end in skin diving accidents. In 1950 the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors asked the Department of Parks and Recreation to maintain a safety instruction program so that the danger element involved in skin diving might be kept at a minimum. Since then, over 50,000 persons have been trained by the County program and with a perfect safety record.
