Advanced, averages 126 and up, will have two scratch leagues in which to choose with maximums of 405 and 435. Ten teams are scheduled for each league.

Two nightly leagues for the ladies are also scheduled. First, a scratch trio on Tuesday at 9 p.m., 475 maximum, ten teams, bowl "four" games. Second, a ladies handicap quartet on Monday at 9 p.m., ten teams—no maximum.

BOWLING FASHIONS


Gable House and the Silverwoods store at the Del Amo Shopping Center have collaborated on a very original window display at Silverwoods.
