Special School For Handicapped Will Open Doors

A new elementary school for education of physically handicapped children—known as the C. Morley Sellery School for the Handicapped—will open its doors for the first time in this area when the Los Angeles City Schools begin the fall semester on September 11.

The school, which will serve a portion of the southwestern area, is now nearing completion at 15804 Budlong Ave., it was announced by Superintendent of Schools Ellis A. Jarvis.

The \$1,000,000 Sellery School—cost of buildings alone is \$805,964—was designed for the Los Angeles City Schools by Architects Kegley, Westphall, and Arbogast, and was constructed by Carter-Mack Builders.

Opening of the Sellery School for the Handicapped will relieve overcrowding at three other similar elementary schools—Pacific Boulevard in Huntington Park, Washington Boulevard in Los Angeles, and Harlan Shoemaker in San Pedro.

Initial enrollment of the new school will be 257 pupils who will be transported daily to and from their classes by six 24-passenger buses and three 12-passenger buses.

A staff of 14 teachers, nine child attendants, and clerks and custodians have been assigned to the school. In addition, other specialists will also serve the children attending the school. They include a cafeteria manager, a physical therapist, an occupational therapist, a corrective physical education teacher, and a speech correction teacher.

The area which the school will serve is bounded generally by Lomita Blvd. on the south, the ocean on the east, Slauson Blvd. on the north, and the Harbor Freeway on the east.

Children attending the school will include orthopedically handicapped as well as those afflicted with cerebral palsy. Small classes will enable teachers to give children specialized attention.

In addition to two special programs will be conducted, one for children who are both physically handicapped and severely mentally retarded.

The second program will consist of a parent-child development center for trainable mentally retarded children. Provisions of this experimental program will have children attending classes daily while the parents will attend the class once weekly under terms of an adult education program.

Poverty, Importance of Spain Told by Reporter

For the good of those who may wish to travel in Spain, I have found out that the prices of food and other commodities are the cheapest in Europe. A good average meal will cost the individual (four courses) about 60 cents. A subway ride, including transfers, only two cents, a haircut with shampoo, 55 cents. One can really live it up here on very little.

The people of Spain, however, are not free to discuss political issues on world affairs. I tried to pry information out of policemen, ordinary citizens and official guides, but not much was forthcoming. I did get an admission from a few guides on the base we have in Spain and also at the base we maintain for SAC here, that they feel our bases may get them into trouble with Russia.

The average Spaniard makes less than \$50 a month. A lot of the land is barren but a lot of activity seems to be in progress. I noticed much in the way of building activities. Apartments, seven and eight stories high, are being built and a number of small industries are rising. As I traveled through their stores I noticed the lack of people buying. Those who were buying were tourists from America and from some of the more prosperous nations of Europe. This is quite a contrast to the mobs buying in the German stores.

Spain, because of its strategic location along the Mediterranean and Atlantic coast and because of its large total land area, is an important addition to the Western block nations of the free world. Economically it is still far below the standard of other Common Market nations that I described in previous articles. However, one sees continued progress and development.

The important thing for the future is that Spain receive continued assistance from the Western nations (not only the U.S.) and from private investors so that it can eventually come into the Common Market on an equal footing with other western countries.

The development of such a free enterprise system in Spain would preclude the possibility of the emergence of communism in this country.
