

'Indy' Start Slated For Midget Premier

Thirty-three cars will line up for a three-abreast "Indy" type start for the big 50-lap main event slated for Tuesday night, Aug. 29, at Ascot Park half-mile dirt oval. Promoter Jess Channon, Torrance resident and former midget driver, has lured famed Gilmore starter Dominic Destarce out of a 15-year retirement to flag the races. Destarce's appearance will stir many sentimental memories for those who remember the days when midget racing was at its peak of popularity. The highly respected midget starter has kept himself in excellent physical condition down through the years and is agile now as he was when he flagged such greats as Bill Vukovich, Johnny Parsons, Rex Mays, Bob Swanson, Walt Faulkner. Jess Channon launched Walt Faulkner on his midget racing career back in 1938. **HIGHLIGHT** The 50-lap feature will highlight an eight-event slate with qualifying trials set for 7 p.m. and a trophy dash at 8:30 p.m. at the 183rd and Vermont racing plant. Jack Brunner top flight big car chauffeur from Gardena, heads the list of newcomers to the United Racing Association ranks who are lining up mounts for the big Premier. Others include Paul Jones, Torrance, big car driver who is seeking a fast midget Offenhauser for the opening, and Jim Hancock, former daredevil with Joey Chitwood who arrived on the coast recently from Massachusetts for his first crack at midget racing. Grunion to Begin Last Run Tonight

Last chance this year for Southlanders to capture their share of the elusive, silvery grunion begins tonight, reports the Marine Resources branch of the Department of Fish and Game. The final four-night run of grunion for the 1961 season is scheduled to hit the sandy ocean beaches of Southern California starting tonight from about 10 p.m. to 11 p.m. Thereafter, one-hour runs are expected to begin about 11 p.m. on Aug. 28, midnight on Aug. 29, and 1 a.m. on the night of Aug. 30. Starting times for these spawning runs are approximate. Grunion run on most beaches in Southern California, but are most likely to show up on quiet, uncrowded stretches of sand. Good runs have been reported on the beaches at Santa Barbara, Malibu, Santa Monica, Venice, Hermosa Beach, Cabrillo Beach, Long Beach, Elmont, Huntington Beach, Newport Beach, Corona Del Mar, Doheny Beach, Del Mar, La Jolla, Mission Beach and Coronado Strand.
