Film Festival Accepts Pub. Service Film

A public service film produced by the Southern California Gas Company has been accepted for entry in the 1962 International Film Festival in San Francisco.

The film, "The Other Side of the Street," will be entered in the festival's second annual "Film Communication" competition conducted November 1 to 14 under the auspices of the San Francisco Art Commission.

"The Other Side of the Street," in this case the "under" side of the street, deals with the problems faced by a community in maintaining its maze of underground conduits for gas, water, and so on with a minimum of inconvenience to residents of the community.

Non-theatrical films produced with a specified purpose for defined audiences will be screened in the "Film as Communication" competition. A special "Golden Gate Award" will be granted, at the discretion of the judges, to the outstanding film in each seven contest categories. "Street" will compete in the category for industrial and institutional films produced for public use.

The film was produced by Southern California Gas Company in collaboration with Los Angeles Substructures Committee, an organization composed of representatives from city and county agencies and the local utilities. It was

Newsmen Plan For Celebration

Southern California newsmen will celebrate a legislative victory at a Beverly Hilton Hotel dinner September 25, according to an announcement by Henry Rieger, general chairman of the event.

Rieger is president of the Los Angeles chapter of Sigma Delta Chi, national journalistic fraternity.

Cause for the celebration was occasioned by passage of Assembly Bill 65 which has the effect of placing newsmen in the same category with the other professions which enjoy "privileged communications" status, according to the announcement.

Assemblyman Tom Carrell, San Fernando, who authored the bill, will be guest of honor at the dinner.

The announcement said that the dinner is not being sponsored by any existing organization or association but by individuals in the news-gathering field who feel that "A.B. 65's passage should be appropriately celebrated and its author appropriately honored."

Under the terms of the newly enacted law, newsmen can not be compelled to reveal their sources of information.

Garden Path Plant Hints

The proper planting for a garden path depends entirely on the scale of your garden. In estate size settings, for instance, an expanse of lawn that sweeps up to path's edge and perhaps a row of trees are sufficient; but how many of us own estates? For most of us, a path is the walk at the side of our house or up to the front door. Its more intimate and requires more careful planting.

The ultimate edging is a combination of annuals, perennials and shrubs. It results

from experience and experiment. You can obtain some results right now, however, with annuals, several of which are selected by the California Association of Nurserymen as ideally suited for edgings. They give you color in a hurry and after planting them, you can start thinking about more permanent things.

Use such annuals as the Dwarf Marigolds and Alyssum to trim a walk. Lobelia is still to be found and makes an ideal edging as do the lovely blue mounds of Floss Flower, or Ageratum. These are worth replanting year in and year out—even when you have more permanent plants to rely on. Start earlier with them next year and enjoy them through summer.

In the week ahead, plan to start a more permanent edging. Remember that colorful blooms are nice, but so are many shrubs with none to offer. Dwarf Boxwood for instance, defines a neat and formal row that will appeal to many. Creeping Juniper and the mounding Blue Fescue can share space side by side. A bed of Ivy trimmed back to the edge of the path can be attractive.

Several ground hugging perennials should be considered, both for their bloom and for their year-round presentability. The perennial Basket of Gold Alyssum, Can-

dytuft, and Dusty Miller are excellent choices.

Succulents should also be used—Stoncrop, Houseleek and the familiar Hen and Chickens, As mentioned

above, the perfect edging is an individual matter and seldom to be found in one type of plant. The gardener should experiment until he finds the combination he likes.
