

# County Schedules New Street Lights For Lomita

Forty-nine additional street lights may be installed throughout the Lomita Light District in the near future, Supervisor Burton W. Chace said this week.

A petition to obtain approval of this project from the Board of Supervisors is now being circulated in this area. The approximate boundaries of the district are: the City of Los Angeles on the east, 263rd St. on the south, Crenshaw Blvd. and Atkinson Ave. on the west, and 240th St. on the north.

Supervisor Chace said that signatures of 100 or more property owners within the district are needed for the approval. Residents interested in this project are urged to contact Mrs. Diane G. Myers of 25925 Narbonne Ave., who is handling the petition.

The Los Angeles County Road Department will prepare plans and specifications

to install the new lights after the formal approval is obtained.

In a second announcement Supervisor Chace also disclosed approval of plans and specifications for improvements to County Waterworks District No. 13, Lomita.

This will be the fourth and final phase of a complete water distribution system being installed in the service area of the former Narbonne Ranch Water Company No. 2, Chace said. Upon completion, all customers will receive water at a pressure of 60 to 70 pounds per square inch.

Cost of the work is estimated at \$56,000.

## Philharmonic Renews Program With LA Schools

More than 20,000 students in the Los Angeles City School System will again hear performances by the Los Angeles Philharmonic Orchestra, it was announced today by Superintendent of Schools Ellis A. Jarvis.

Concerts will be presented by the orchestra on October 27 and 31, November 1, 2, 3, and 7, the superintendent said in reporting the renewal of the cultural program for city school students which was first started in the early 1940's with the Southern California Symphony Association, the orchestra's sponsor.

Three of the six concerts will be presented at Hollywood High School with others scheduled at East Los Angeles College, Gardena High School, and Reseda High School.

Each performance will consist of two programs of approximately 40 minutes each, one for elementary students and the other for secondary school pupils.

Conductor and commentator for the concerts shall be Dr. Howard Hanson.

A speech on "Quality Products Always Win" won the best speaker of the evening award for William Franklin of Torrance, during the regular South Bay Toastmasters Club 280 meeting held each Wednesday at the Elks Club, Redondo Beach.

William Franklin's speech was one of four Basic Training Talks given by the members to demonstrate how speeches can be improved by the effective use of pauses.

Thomas Eadie of Hollywood Riviera gave an educational talk which illustrated the proper use of notes to round out the instructional portion of the evening's program.

Chairman Donald Payne of Torrance presided over the extemporaneous Table Topics speech session which was won by Dr. Robert Seaman of Manhattan Beach.

Next week's meeting will feature a formal speech program developed around the theme of "Pleading Your Case" and educational speech by an experienced speaker on "A Successful Toastmaster."

In addition to adult speakers that will appear before clubs, organizations and employee groups this fall, a junior speakers bureau has been planned.


These speakers are members of the Community Chest youth services such as Boy Scouts, Girl Scouts, Camp Fire Girls, USO, YWCA and CYO.


