Nationally-Known Trio Appear at ECC Sept. 26

Folk songs will be the specialty of the Limelighters, a nationally-known trio, which will appear on the El Camino campus Sept. 26 at 8:15 p.m. in the women's gymnasium.

Tickets are \$1.50 for bleacher seats and \$2.00 for chairs on the floor of the gym and are on sale now in the Student Store.

Although tickets may be purchased at the door that evening, it would be wise to reserve seats beforehand, Henrietta C. Martin, assistant director of student personnel, advised.

The Limelighters are composed of Alex Massilev, a banjo player; Louis Gottlieb, a bassist; a Glenn Yarbrough, a guitarist.

The act began when the three met in May, 1959, in a small town in Colorado. They were booked at the

Hungry I in San Francisco three months later, after which they played to 125,000 people in 30 major cities.

They also have a top-selling album to their credit called "Tonight: In Person, The Limelighters."

El Camino Student Is "Outstanding" In US Competition

Rudolph H. Johnson, El Camino College pre-medical major, has been selected the outstanding chemistry student during the last school year in national competition sponsored by the Chemical Rubber Company, William T. Mooney, assistant director of instruction at El Camino, announced today.

Johnson placed first in the Far West Region, 14th annual nation-wide Achievement Award Program, sponsored by the Publications Division of the company. He will receive a Certificate of Merit from the Chemical Rubber Company, and in addition, \$100 worth of scientific books will be donated to the El Camino College library, in honor of his achievement. Each book will include a bookplate with the college name and a suitable inscription, giving credit to Johnson and the college.

Johnson received the award by virtue of his performance on a two-hour examination conducted in May in competition with general chemistry award winners of most of the colleges and universities in the seven western states and several Canadian colleges. A presentation ceremony of the books and the certificate will be held early in the fall semester as a feature of a chemistry seminar.

Johnson, graduated from Narbonne High School in 1960 and has completed two semesters at El Camino College. At the completion of his work at El Camino, he plans to transfer to UCLA. He is 19 years old and resides at 4114 W. 177th St., Torrance.
