Jarvis was born in Utah in 1903. Upon graduating from the University of Utah in 1925, he entered the newspaper publishing business as owner-editor. After moving to Los Angeles in 1934 Howard Jarvis became president or owner of a number of manufacturing concerns.

This Republican has held more than fifty positions of trust and responsibility in the past president L.A. County Republican Assembly, vice

president, California Republican Assembly, and Western States Campaign Director 1960 Republican National Committee.

He has made more than 1,500 radio and television appearances both locally and nationally, and has made over 11,000 speeches for the Republican Party.

A couple of his better known phrases are, "A strenge faddler, bound by the courage of his restrictions;" and "The middle of the road is too close to the left."
