

News Of Servicemen

Army Maj. Wilford E. Irish Jr., whose parents live at 20011 Mansel Ave., Torrance, is attending the 38-week regular course at The Command and General Staff College, Fort Leavenworth, Kan. Course began Aug. 25.

Course is designed to prepare selected officers for duty as commanders and general staff officers at division, corps and field army levels.

Included in Irish's class are 665 U. S. officers from the active Army, Army Reserve and National Guard, Navy, Air Force and Marine Corps, in addition to 85 officers from 48 allied nations.

The attendance of Army Reserve and National Guard personnel, who are on temporary active duty to attend the course, is indicative of the Army's effort to train and maintain "One Army."

The college, the Army's senior tactical school, was established in 1881 as the School of Application of Infantry and Cavalry.

graduated from Niagara University in Niagara Falls, N.Y., in 1949 and from Stetson University in De Land, Fla., in 1961.

Serving aboard the attack cargo ship USS Tulare, operating in the Western Pacific, is Richard T. Cabella, fireman, USN, son of Mr. and Mrs. Alfred W. Cabella of 1608 W. 226th St., Torrance.

The ship recently participated in "Operation Sharp-edge," a joint Seventh Fleet, Eighth Army, and Republic of Korea Air Force and Army amphibious exercise, held at Pohang, Korea.

Serving with the Third Marine Aircraft Wing at the El Toro Marine Corps Air Station, Santa Ana, is Marine Cpl. Robert R. Felix, son of Mr. and Mrs. Oscar R. Felix of 2273 Del Amo Blvd., Torrance.

Medical Speech Offered To Civic Organizations

Wyle Laboratory Develops Wedge As Propellant

Wyle Laboratories has designed and developed a new high-accuracy dynamic flow sampling wedge for use in ground support propellant loading systems.

The wedge also has a wide commercial and industrial applications in such diverse industries as refineries, distilleries, and dairies. Lee N. Mortenson, manager, research and analysis department, said, "Accuracies to within 2.5 per cent in the prediction of mainstream contaminant levels, over extreme density variation ranges, are provided by the new wedge, he said.

The sampler is designed so that its unique high-accuracy performance extends to sampling of high-pressure flows, Mortenson emphasized. The flow sampling wedge can be used with any liquid, gas, or combination, and under virtually any conditions of flow, temperature, and pressure.

The possibility of errors due to settling is eliminated by collection a "slice" specimen of fluid covering the full vertical cross section of the stream.

Wyle Laboratories designed and developed the dynamic sampling wedge in support of a propellant loading system filter evacuation program conducted for Air Force Ballistic Systems Division. Wyle has filed a patent application on the new wedge.
