UCLA Extension Films Scheduled for South Bay

An international film series of "Neglected Masterpieces," five programs of motion pictures, representing a wide variety of the world's film production, will be shown in the South Bay area by University of California Extension, beginning Oct. 12 at the Plaza Theatre, Hawthorne.

On the premise that "the history of motion picture making has witnessed an unending spectacle of excellent films which have, because of improper handling and public indifference, never reached the audiences which they deserve." University Extension officials state "the series will be devoted to films which have been artistic successes, but box-office failures.

Schedule of the films is as follows:

Oct. 12, "The Beggar's Opera," made in technicolor in 1953; Christopher Fry adapted the text; Laurence Olivier plays "Captain Macheath," the highwayman who escapes from the law and the doxies. The film is said to be "more fun than any other neglected movie of the past... light, playful and sophisticated." Olivier's Macheath is a brilliant caricature of the romantic bandit. "Bow Bells," a 15-minute English documentary, will be shown with it.

Oct. 26 "Friends for Life" (Amici per la Pella), a prize-winning film at the 1955 Venice International Film Festival. This was the first film of director Franco Rossi. In spite of its warmth and its unforced performance, the film has not succeeded in winning a single West Coast release. This will be its first lo-

cal showing. "Praise the Sea," a Netherlands film, and "A Place in the Sun" from Czechoslovakia will be shown with it.

Nov. 9, "Seven Samurai," a Japanese film awarded the Grand Prize at the 1954 Venice Film Festival. This is the original version of Hollywood's recent "The Magnificent Seven."

The story concerns the defense of a Sixteenth Century village by seven recruited, professional soldiers. "Corral," a Canadian film, will be shown with it.

Nov. 30, "Subida Al Cielo," awarded the International Critics' Prize at the 1952 Cannes International Film Festival. This is a film of gentle humor and incisive humanism, directed by Luis Brunuel, one of the world's most controversial film makers.

"The Kiss," a film made in the USA in 1959 and "Glass" made in Holland in 1958, directed by Bert Haanstra will be shown with it.

Dec. 14, "La Grande Illusion," selected for showing at the 1958 Brussels World's Fair as "One of the five greatest motion pictures of all time."

Directed by Jean Renoir, it is a perceptive study of human needs and the subtle barriers of class among a group of prisoners and their captors during World War I. "The History of the Cinema" made in England in 1956 will be shown with it.
