

Danish Art On Display At Gallery

The "Arts of Denmark," an exhibition described as "too priceless to insure" was opened to the public today after a reception last night at Municipal Art Gallery presided over by Julius Bomholt, Danish Minister of Cultural Affairs who flew to Los Angeles from Copenhagen for the occasion.

As a special representative of the Danish Government, Minister Bomholt, at the inaugural ceremony, addressed an invited audience of more than 500 dignitaries, socialites and civic leaders.

Other speakers included Mayor Samuel Yorty, A. Holstrup Pedersen, president of the Danish Society of the Danish Society of Arts and Crafts, A. C. Karsten, Danish Consul General and Kenneth Ross, general manager of the Los Angeles Department of Municipal Art.

The exhibition, having its final showing in the U.S. before its return to Denmark, is designed to reveal the continuity of one nation's art through 10,000 years.

The exhibition is being presented under the auspices of the Los Angeles Department of Municipal Art, and is sponsored by the Danish Government in cooperation with the Municipal Art Patrons.

Finn Juhl, internationally known designer and architect of the exhibition, personally supervised the installation of over 500 pieces collected from Royal and public museums and private collections in Denmark.

Erik Kjersgaard of the National Museum of Denmark is another member of the Danish party who is traveling with the exhibition which has been seen in New York, Chicago and in San Francisco where it had more than 250,000 visitors in its six weeks showing there.

Wider in scope than most exhibitions, arts and crafts from 8000 B.C. to the present day are included. Pre-historic weapons, jewelry, ceramics, textiles and furniture vividly show design trends continuing into contemporary times.

Tiny figures of a bear and bird carved in glowing amber between Stone Age spears, harpoons and utilitarian objects foreshadow the design and practical elegance of 20th century furniture, glass, silver, ceramics and jewelry.

Contemporary furniture and crafts fill over half of the gallery space and suggest a "Who's Who" of famed Danish Designers.

One of the world's earliest wind instruments, a six-foot spiraling, s-shaped Lurs, comes from the Bronze Age. The early historian Tacitus wrote that the sound of Lurs, always blown in pairs, would frighten the wits out of an enemy. Jewelry, helmets and battle axes are reminders of intrepid Viking explorers.

A life-sized oak figure of St. George slaying the dragon, dated around 1520, dominates the whole gallery.

The "Arts of Denmark" may be seen through Oct. 29. Admission charge is 50 cents for adults and 25 cents for persons under 18. The Municipal Art Gallery is located in Barnsdall Park, 4800 Hollywood Blvd. off Vermont Avenue. The Gallery will be open from 1 to 9 p.m., weekdays, and 1 to 5 p.m. Saturday and Sunday.

Engle Appointed by Johnson To New Senate Committee

Sen. Clair Engle (D-Calif.) has been named to participate in a U.S. Senate study to determine how the nation can meet its constantly expanding need for more oil, gas, coal, and hydro-electric and other power resources.

Vice President Lyndon Johnson appointed Senator Engle to serve with the Senate Interior Committee which will make the study in an executive capacity.

"We take it for granted that fuel and power will be there when we want it, but certain areas of the country are already running short and it'll get worse unless we start planning now," Engle said in explaining the purpose of the study.

He pointed out, for example, that Southern California has changed from one of the nation's energy surplus areas to one with a substantial deficit in the last few years.

"This region now is importing natural gas from Texas, petroleum from the Middle East and plans are being evaluated on the feasibility of bringing Pacific Northwest hydroelectric power to Los Angeles," he said.

Nursing Program Started at ECC

Plans call for a two-year schedule of concentrated study toward an Associate Degree in Nursing. Students of the program will be eligible at graduation to write the California State Board of Nursing Examination for licensure as registered nurses.

Coordination of nursing activities will be under the direction of Mrs. Cynthia G. Barnes, R.N. Mrs. Barnes has had 25 years of nursing experience with a range that includes general duty staff nurse, psychiatric nursing, supervisor, public health nursing and teaching.

"The El Camino program has been initiated to fulfill a very real need for bedside

"It is our hope to have a carefully planned curriculum and guidance service that will

prepare nurses to administer sympathetic and competent nursing care," she said.

Requirements of the California State Board of Nurse Examiners emphasize that

the college must spend one year in planning the correlation of clinical experience and academic study undertaken

by the college program.
