Urge Vaccination As Warning Sees Influenza Rise

Because of an expected rise in influenza this fall, vaccination against the infection without delay was strongly urged this week by the respiratory disease committee of the Tuberculosis and Health Association of Los Angeles County.

Noting that Surgeon General Luther L. Terry of the U.S. Public Health Service had recently warned of a possible upswing in the influenza cycle this fall, Dr. J. J. Quilligan, Jr., committee member, pointed out that it is recommended that people who have tuberculosis, emphysema, or other respiratory disease should be vaccinated immediately.

"When influenza strikes people who are already partially disabled by cardiac or respiratory disease, the consequences may be extremely grave," Dr. Quilligan said. "It is urged that they be vaccinated annually during the summer before the winter months, when the prevalence of influenza usually increases," he said.

He added that the National Tuberculosis Association was alerting its 2700 local Christmas Seal affiliates to the possible influenza upswing and is asking them to cooperate in every way possible with plans of health officers and private physicians in a drive to vaccinate high-risk groups.

These groups include people with lung disease, heart disease, diabetes and other chronic illnesses, people more than 65 years of age, and pregnant women.
