Bob Hoover of 880 Via Del Monte, Palos Verdes Estates, was honored by the Air Force this week for his contribution to the world of flight.

In ceremonies at the West Coast Headquarters of the Air Force Systems Command, Inglewood, Hoover was presented with a certificate of merit.

The certificate was signed by Air Force Secretary Eugene Zuckert and Chief of Staff Curtis E. LeMay.

Hoover, a veteran of hundreds of precision aerial demonstrations, has flown more than 300 different types of airplanes.

Aviation Fair Set For Next Week Features Stunts

A five-day world's fair of by two days of stunt flying aviation will be climaxed reminiscent of the barnstorming days of the '20's during the 1961 International Air Show scheduled for Chino Airport, October 25 to 29.

The event, under direction of internationally known pilot, Frank G. Tellman, is being planned as an annual affair starting this year. Original aircraft, many not seen in the sky for a generation, will portray five decades of progress in aviation from the first free-flying, hot-air balloons, through the best of the Wright Brothers era, World War I, the stunters of the roaring '20's, and on down to the Mach-busting jets of today.

The public will be admitted every day between 10 a.m. and sunset, with admission free the first three days. During this period, all aircraft can be viewed at close range, including such old-timers as a 1910 Bleriot, Nieuport 38, Sopwith Camel and Fokker D-7. There will also be many displays of products and equipment by leading manufacturers and services in civil aviation.

LOTS OF ACTION

Saturday and Sunday, October 28 and 29, will be action-filled toppers. Famous pilots, stunt men and parachutists from all over the country will appear between 1 and 4 p.m. over the 7,000-foot Chino airstrip in such thrilling acts as hot-air balloon ascensions, races between antique planes and early automobiles, mass parachute jumps, re-enactments of World War I combats between Capt. Eddie Rickenbacker's Nieuport 28 and a German Fokker D-7, as well as fly-bys of famous historical aircraft and modern jets.

One of the stars for the roaring '20's portion of the air show is Cliff Winters of Hollywood, California. He will perform stunts for which he has become famous, such as plane-to-plane changes in the air, low altitude parachute drops, wing-walking, and his fantastic bat-man drop. He will climax his act by staging an actual plane crash in front of the main grandstand area.

TICKETS

Tickets for this part of the International Air Show are \$2 for adults and \$1 for children, for general admission, with reserved seats available at an additional \$1. Tickets may be purchased at the show, or ordered ahead of time by writing P.O. Box 76367, Los Angeles 4.

An added attraction during the entire show, designed especially to please the feminine members among the 80,000 expected spectators, will be 20 hostesses dressed in authentic costumes of the different eras between 1900 and the present.

Owners of private planes planning to fly to the Air Show may land and take off at the Chino Airport any time except during actual flying periods.

Native Plant Can Beat Dry Season

It's a miracle, no less, that our native plants even survive the long, hot months of California's dry season. And it's a miracle compounded that, having survived, they should bloom so profusely. But it happens every spring on our hillsides.

Among the loveliest of these miracles is Ceanothus, the Wild Lilac which adorns the hills with its lovely blue blossoms in late winter and spring. Of the many natives that can be tamed for garden use, it is probably the most widely used and versatile.

As most of us know by now, the Wild Lilacs are not true Lilacs. The common name derives from the general shape and looks of the blooms. These are generally smaller than true Lilacs but of similar appearance. They are largely in shades of blue, but an occasional white can also be found.

A wide variety of Wild Lilacs have been tamed and are offered to the public by members of the California Association of Nurserymen. Their versatility can be pointed up by the fact that some are ground covers, some are medium shrubs and others are trees.

The favorite ground cover, since it really hugs the ground, is the Point Reyes Creeper. This is a glossy leaved shrub with a distinctive holly-like shape to the leaves. Carmel Creeper is more shrubby, but still an excellent cover for waste spaces. It forms a dense growth about two feet high and some 6 to 10 feet in diameter.

Of the more shrub-like Wild Lilacs, the hybrids Sierra Blue, Mountain Haze and Julia Phelps, are profuse bloomers and generally larger of bloom than those taken directly from nature. Hybridization has not robbed them of their rugged indifference to cultural demands, however.

Water Most Important In Garden

Water in the garden has a timeless appeal. It is the historic symbol of peace and contentment, sought after in Asia and Europe alike, centuries before the dawn of modern landscape design.

Whether the gardens of Imperial Japan, the elaborate installations of Moorish Spain and the fountains of ancient Rome.

Whether at rest or in motion, water can be the center of attention in the garden. A pool, a fountain, a waterfall—even a birdbath can make the garden more pleasant, provided, of course, that the proper plants are used in conjunction with it.

If you would like to install a pool in your garden, ask a member of the California Association of Nurserymen for advice. He can help you not only with the planting around the pool, but with the actual plan for one as well.

If running water is part of your plans, he can order a small circulating pump that will make it possible. And if the decorative, artificial bowl-fountains seen so often in the garden shows are desired, he can furnish those, too.

The true beauty of any garden pool, however, derives not so much from the design, as in the planting that surrounds it—from the way you fit it into your landscape. Whether grass grows right up to the pool's edge or whether intricate plant patterns are devised makes no difference so long as the plan is well conceived.

And here, your nurseryman can do the most for you. Material is plentiful. It's a matter of fitting the right plants to the right pool.

Consideration should be given to the reflective value of shrubs planted on the margin of a pool. Imagine the reflected beauty of a Bird of Paradise plant, for instance. Or of the many

Non-blooming shrubs such as Heavenly Bamboo, Paper Reed and Phaxis Palm also have reflective value.

Planting the pool can be a hobby in itself, but don't be over-zealous. Remember that you have a pool mainly to see water close at hand, and over-planting can defeat your purpose. Better a margin of grass only, than one which hides the view.
