Metropolitan Conference Weekend Record Reported

All the classic ingredients that go into making an epic football game are present as Bakersfield prepares to invade Long Beach Veterans Memorial Stadium to meet Long Beach in the featured battle on the Metropolitan Conference schedule.

Both teams are undefeated in and out of the conference with 6-0 records. The two are among the nation's 10 top junior college squads. Both elevens are replete with devastating ground and air attacks.

There's also a revenge motif. Last year Long Beach's 27-7 triumph over the Renegades shot the Vikings into the conference championship and handed them a Junior Rose Bowl berth.

The bitter defeat was the only one Bakersfield has suffered in its last 32 games. Meanwhile, Long Beach has a 16-game win streak on the line.

The two titans set up their showdown with easy triumphs last week. Bakersfield stormed past East Los Angeles, 44-0, while Long Beach ripped Harbor, 42-6.

EL CAMINO WINS
In the other two Metro games, El Camino downed Valley College, 24-0, and Santa Monica, also sporting a 6-0 record, torpedoes San Diego, 44-14.

Santa Monica also draws a tough assignment Saturday when it invades El Ca-

mino. The Warriors were the only ones to score on Bakersfield this season, and also gave Long Beach a mighty scare before succumbing, 29-22.

VALLEY VS. HARBOR
Friday tussles pit San Diego against host East Los Angeles and visiting Valley College against Harbor College. All kickoffs are at 8 p.m.

Bakersfield and Long Beach have met three common opponents this season, El Camino, East Los Angeles and Harbor College.

Halfback Dee Andrews appeared not a whit off his timing after being sidelined for the El Camino game the week before. The Long Beach ace galloped 56 yards for one touchdown, dashed 5 yards for another and also ran over a 2-point conversion to boost his conference leading point total to 74.

Jerry Orcutt struck twice for scores on short plunges and quarterback Chris Dawson, who fired four TD passes against El Camino, came back with a pair against Harbor. He hit Gary Garrison on a 69-yard play and connected to Rich Van Wert for a second tally on a 5-yard pitch.

EL CAMINO HELD
The sturdy Valley defense held El Camino to a 2-point halftime lead, but the Warriors broke through for 16 points in the third period to lock up its second confer-

Local Ice Hockey Team Meets Portland Tonight

Badly crippled and with three rookies in the lineup, the Los Angeles Blades near the end of a rugged road trip when they face Portland tonight before returning home for Saturday night's game with the nomadic San Francisco Seals.

The Portland-Blade game will be telecast live to Southern California tonight at 8 p.m. by KTTV (11).

Injuries suffered during the 5-0 loss to Edmonton Wednesday forced the Blades to add two rookies to the lineup in order to bring the squad to numerical strength.

Lynn Bentley, center, from the Blades' farm club at Saskatoon, Saskatchewan, and Bruce Lea, left wing who played with Minneapolis of the International League last season, joined the team for play in Friday night's 7-1 loss to the Edmonton Flyers.

In the Wednesday battle with Edmonton, the Blades lost defenseman George Konik for six weeks with a jaw fracture, and Right Wing

Jim Powers for one week with a badly cut foot. In addition, Center Terry Slater and Defenseman Don McLeod suffered hand and leg bruises, respectively, early in the game and did not return to action.

Slater was unavailable for both Friday's game with Edmonton and Saturday's contest against Calgary. Slater flew to Ottawa, where he was married Saturday to the former Agatha Sullivan. The wedding plans had been made before Slater was traded by Hull-Ottawa of the Eastern Professional Hockey League to the Blades. He returned for Sunday's game at Portland.

McLeod saw action Friday, but was badly hampered by a charleyhorse.

Although the Blades gratefully conclude their nine-game road trip at Portland tonight, their Saturday foes, San Francisco, must play away from home until Nov. 17, when the Cow Palace ice first becomes available. The Seals play 14 games on the road before that date.

McEwen, Mundersbach Clash Saturday In Hot Rod Session at L.A.D.S.

Winds of over 40 mph cancelled out last Saturday night's rubber match-race between national record holder Lefty Mundersbach of Pico-Rivera and Tom McEwen of Long Beach at Lions Drag Strip in Long Beach.

McEwen and Mundersbach, who have each won nine of their 18 meetings so far this year, will face off this Saturday night; however, McEwen has had a change of "mounts." This week he will be driving a Mickey Thompson experimental dragster, powered by a supercharged Pontiac engine running on fuel. The engine has been destroyed down to only 289 cubic inches.

Also in the offering for fans will be a match race between television star Tommy Ivo of Burbank and Don Hampton of Bellflower. Hampton, currently No. 10 on the country's "Top Ten" list, will be defending his national ranking in the match, which will go to the winner of the best two out of three.

Ivo, who has been out of drag racing for several months due to the filming of the ABC-TV series "Marge," is favored to win the title in spite of the layoff.
