## Dedicate Building At Lomita Church

There will be a dedication of the new elementary building at First Baptist Church of Lomita, Sunday at 2 p.m. Dr. R. C. White of Houston, Tex. will deliver a brief

message following the ceremonies and recognition of the building committee.

Open house and guided tour of the new building will be from 1:30 until 2 p.m. and from 2:30 until 3:30 p.m. There will be a "Singspiration" in the main auditorium following a brief dedication service.

The new building is 42 by 68 with 2800 square feet of floor space constructed of frame stucco. It contains a reception center at the entrance, two restrooms, two kindergarten departments and four nursery departments.

This building has been approved by the State Social Welfare Division for Child Care, the Building Commission, and Fire Department for safety.

This building is used daily except Saturday in the Hillcrest Christian Day School program and one Sunday with regular activities of Sunday School and Training Union.


