El Camino College wrestlers will host defending state champions from San Bernardino Valley College Friday night in the Men's Gymnasium at 7:30 p.m.

El Camino Alumni again nosed out the El Camino team by one point in a 17-16 tilt. Last year the Alumni nudged the college varsity out 19-18.

Frank Addleman, in deciding ECC grappler Dennis Albright 4-1, was awarded the outstanding alumni wrestler's trophy at the conclusion of the meet.

Alum Jun Watanabe, 123 pounds, soundly defeated Ray Pogue 13-2, starting the Alumni team off with three points. Watanabe last year won the San Diego Naval Invitational, Olympic style wrestling, as a varsity member of the El Camino squad.

The 130-pound division was forfeited to Dale Deffner, making the score 8-0 in favor of the Alums.


