### Armco Reports Department Head Changes

Robert H. Etnyre has been appointed manager of machinery production for National Supply division of Armco Steel Corporation.

### Farmer's Guide On Taxes Ready For Delivery

Internal Revenue Commissioner Mortimer M. Caplin announced farmer's guides on taxes are available for the calendar year 1961.

Commissioner Caplin said that one million copies of the comprehensive green and white booklet are now available for the asking at local Internal Revenue Service offices and from county farm agents.

The early release of the publication is part of Internal Revenue's stepped-up program for improved information, education and service to all taxpayers.

The 15 chapters of the booklet contain easy to read instructions in both general and specialized areas of Federal income and self-employment taxes as they apply to farmers.

Discussed are: filing requirements and return forms, the importance of good records (with illustrations of sample record forms, farm inventories, trades, condemnations, diseased livestock, the new feed grains program payments, marketing quota penalties, and many other subjects.

A farmer's tax calendar has been added this year which tells the farmer what he should do and when he should do it in regard to his Federal taxes during 1962.

A sample filled-in federal tax return is also contained in the booklet.

Caplin, in announcing the new edition of the booklet, pointed out that the expanded tax assistance program for farmers will include utilization of all news media to insure maximum dissemination of information on tax matters of interest to farmers.

He noted participation by Internal Revenue officials in meetings of local farm groups to discuss federal tax problems, as well as offering assistance to farmers on an individual basis by telephone, letter, or personal visit to Internal Revenue offices.

Following recommendations of the chamber's Water Resources Committee headed by Robert L. Minckler of Los Angeles, opposition was expressed by the chamber board to the provisions of the President's proposed Water Resources Planning Act (S.2246).

Endorsement was also given Senator Kuchel's proposal to require federal officials administering public land to respect state water laws "as a beginning step in restoring control and authority over water rights to the states."

The Water Resources Planning Act proposed by the President would "tend to nationalize all water and related natural resources development," Minckler commented.

"It would create a situation in which local and state interests would be relegated to a position of minor participation in the comprehensive planning and development of water resources."

"It would substitute the judgement of a small group of men, all presidential appointees, for that of the combined membership of Congress."

"California has controlled its water supplies and its water supplies and planned irrigation works along lines best suited to our local needs, and there is no need for any federal control or intervention by the federal government in the field of comprehensive water planning," he said.

"Senator Kuchel's bill is sound and would resolve two of the major problems raised by the recent Supreme Court cases in the federal and state water rights relationships," Minckler said.


Endorsement of the Kuchel bill was expressed during the recent annual meeting of the state chamber in Los Angeles by Northcutt Ely, chief counsel for California in the Colorado River litigation pending before the U. S. Supreme Court.

Attorney General Stanley Mosk of California told chamber water leaders that the attorneys general of the western states were also concerned with federal encroachment of water rights and were in support of the chamber's position urging Congress to enact legislation to protect the integrity of state water laws.
