Shofner of the Giants, the league's No. 1 receiver, was nominated for the annual charity classic for the fifth time following New York's 28-21 victory over the Eagles.


Phillips, who played in the Pro Bowl for the first time last January, likewise was named for the fifth time after the Rams' 17-7 win over the 49ers.

Angels Will Play 31 Game Schedule Before Season

A 31-game pre-season schedule will be played by the Los Angeles Angels in 1962, including the previously-announced historic first meeting between the Angels and their city rivals, the Dodgers, on Monday, April 2nd at Palm Springs, Angels' General Manager Fred Haney revealed this week.

The Angels pre-season schedule will be high-lighted by the seven-game barnstorming tour with the Houston Colts 45, announced earlier this week.

The Angels, who will open camp at the Polo Grounds in Palm Springs, Calif. on Tuesday, February 20th, will play 11 games at their spring base. All the contests are against Major League competition—with the five Arizona clubs coming to Palm Springs for two games each, except the Chicago Cubs, who play only once. Twenty-one games will be played on the road next spring.

Only two pre-season games are scheduled against minor league opposition—back-to-back encounters against the Angels' Dallas-Ft. Worth farm club on March 31, at Fullerton and April 1 at Palm Springs.

OPPOSITION

The Houston Colts 45, one of the new National League Clubs, furnish most of the opposition for Bill Rigney's crew. The Angels and Colts 45 meet a total of 14 times—twice in Palm Springs on the opening weekend of action, March 10-11, twice in Apache Junction in Arizona (March 17-18) and twice in San Diego on the weekend of March 24-25. The encounter of the 24th is a Saturday night game. The Angels will be the "home" team in San Diego.

Rigney will have at least 40 players in camp next spring—while the Angels will have nearly twice that number working at their farm club training bases at Fullerton and Anaheim.

The Angels, who had an overall spring training record of 14-13 in 1961, will make two separate trips into Arizona to face the clubs training there.
