Little Company of Mary Sets Founder's Day Dinner

Annual Founders' Day dinner the second anniversary of the Little Company of Mary Hospital, honoring will be held at 7 p.m.

Wednesday, Jan. 31, at the Plush Horse Restaurant.

Principal speaker will be William R. Burke of Palos Verdes Estate, national commander of the American Legion in 1961.

As Legion commander, Burke visited Legion posts not only throughout the United States but also inspected posts and American military installations in Tokyo, Japan; Seoul, Korea; Taipei, Formosa; Hong Kong, Manila and Honolulu. He made a tour of the European area early last year.

Burke, a Navy veteran of World War II, is a public relations executive. MONEY-RAISER Dinner is designed as a money-raising event for the non-profit hospital. Tickets, at \$10 a person or \$20 a couple, may be obtained at Harbor Savings, 1617 S. Pacific Coast Hwy., Redondo Beach; the Bank of America, in downtown Torrance; the Torrance Branch of United California Bank; the Plush Horse Inn; Cabrillo Savings, Pacific Coast Highway and Crenshaw Boulevard; and at the hospital.

The 135-bed hospital admitted 8,764 patients during its second year of operation, an increase of 18 per cent over the first year. It maintained a 74 per cent rate of occupancy.

The second year saw 1,773 births, an increase of 15 per cent. There were 7,000 emergency room cases. There are now 290 doctors on the medical staff, 73 in general practice and 217 in the specialty fields.

In 1961, the Pediatric Department operated at 84 per cent of capacity. High point was reached in February, with a daily average

of 24 patients. There are 336 full and part-time employes on the payroll.

High praise has been bestowed on the volunteer groups. Senior volunteers have contributed more than 25,000 hours to the hospital in the last two years, and Junior Volunteers gave 6,100 hours in 1961, an increase of 500 per cent over 1960.
