## Mrs. Ron L. Sanders Named Mother Of the Year for March of Dimes

In honor of her courage and successful battle against polio patient, Mrs. Ron L. Sanders, 1860 W. 181st St., Torrance, has been named Los Angeles County Mother of the Year by the March of Dimes, retired Sheriff Eugene W. Biscailuz announced recently.

Biscailuz, general county chairman of the annual mercy appeal now in progress, said that Mrs. Sanders, a mother of three, was stricken with polio just over a year ago.

"The night Mrs. Sanders was struck with a disease that most thought was no

longer a threat, little Sharon, 6, Steve, 4, and Stacy, 2 huddled in a chair, confused and frightened at the black void of the future opened up to them," Biscailuz said.

Only a short time before their father had been stricken with blindness.

To help support the family, their mother had taught at San Pedro High School, he said.

"But this courageous mother struggled against this once-feared disease so valiantly and is again taking care of her home—with the good intentioned assistance of the youngsters—and is now back with her pupils during the day," Biscailuz declared.

He urged that all citizens contribute to the March of Dimes, this year pledged to complete the battle against polio and to now achieve a similar victory over birth defects and arthritis.
