Park Lands May Be Used for Streets

The Los Angeles City Recreation and Park Commission Thursday, approved, and forwarded to the Board of Public Works for further processing, a resolution prepared by the City Attorney under provisions of which parcels 48 and 49, Harbor City Park, in the 15th District, represented by Councilman John S. Gibson Jr., would be transferred for public street purposes to the Department of Public Works.

Parcels 48 and 49 are included in parcels 4 and 5 and are portions of two lots on Lomita Blvd., west of Frampton St., and comprise a strip having a frontage of 100 feet and a width of 40 feet which will be used for the widening of Lomita Blvd.



Top Stock Car Pilots Set to Win Sunday's Match

Three of the West's top stock car pilots, Gene Davis of Venice; Jim Cook of Norwalk; and Marvin Heimis of Sylmar head the entry list for this Sunday afternoon's CJA program at Gardena's Western Speedway, 139th St. at So. Western Ave., starting at 2:30 p.m.

More than sixty of Southern California's best stock car racers are entered for Sunday's nine event program, which will be highlighted by a 30-lap main event. Also on the days speed menu will be a 15-lap semi main; a 10-lap consolation; four 8-lap heat races; and a 4-lap trophy dash. Time trials to determine the fastest 18 cars for the feature, start at 1 p.m.

Davis triumphed in the opening race of the year, three weeks ago at Western, driving a powerful Oldsmobile. Cook driving a Dodge led the feature for the first twenty laps until he was spun out of the race.
