


County Proposes Two New Links in Torrance Area

An immediate exploration of all possible means of financing development of eight proposed golf courses two in the Torrance area, for which the county already has the land was ordered this week by the Board of Supervisors on motion of Supervisor Kenneth Hahn. Local courses proposed are in Dominguez and Palos Verdes.

"It is wasteful for the county to have this land off the tax rolls and not being used for any productive purpose," Supervisor Hahn declared.

He pointed out that Western Avenue Golf Course, acquired by the County Retirement Board in 1954 and operated by the County Parks and Recreation Department since then, has been fully self-supporting and has returned a net revenue of about \$80,000 a year to the county treasury.

"There is such a demand for golf courses that players line up at midnight on Saturdays at Western Avenue so that they will be able to play a round of golf on Sunday," Supervisor Hahn continued.

Bakersfield Will Clash With Warriors on Friday

Revenge-minded Bakersfield comes to town Friday at 8 p.m. in an attempt to reverse an earlier Metropolitan Conference basketball loss to El Camino College.

Currently occupying the second-place slot in the conference, the Renegades have dropped only two loop tilts, one being a 56-54 loss to the Tribe. The El Camino victory marked the first time since 1954 that the Warriors came out on the top end on the Bakersfield courts.

Since suffering a pair of early conference licks, the 'Gades have bounced back and have put the skids to every foe since, including loop-leading Valley College. El Camino assumed sole possession of third place in the conference by tripping Harbor, 75 to 67. Previous to the defeat, the Seahawks had been dead-locked with ECC for the show position.
