It is the custom in every Jewish Synagogue to plant a tree to remind the members of the Jewish faith of God's commandment to beautify the earth. Symbolically, the holiday means that we must also beautify the world by Mitzvos (good deeds).

This tree is one of four planted by the children of the religious schools to beautify the grounds surrounding the new Temple Building at 1101 Camino Real, Redondo Beach.
