

Chemistry Student Presented With Award in Nation-Wide Competition

Rudolph H. Johnson, 4114 W. 177th St., Torrance, El Camino pre-medical major, was the recipient recently of the award made annually to the outstanding general chemistry student as determined in national competition sponsored by the Chemical Rubber Company.

Johnson placed first in the Far West Region, 14th annual nation-wide Achievement Award Program, sponsored by the publications division of the company. At a chemistry seminar Thursday, he received a Certificate of merit from the Chemical Rubber Company. In addition, \$100 worth of scientific books have been donated to the El Camino College library, in honor of his achievement. Each book bears a bookplate with the college name and a suitable inscription, giving credit to Johnson and the college.

EXAMINATION
Johnson received the award by virtue of his performance on a two-hour examination conducted in May in competition with general chemistry award winners of most of the colleges and universities in the seven western states and several Canadian colleges.

Johnson studied chemistry at El Camino College under instructors John McQuerry and Dr. Robert Long.

El Camino College has participated in the annual award program for five years. Johnson is the first El Camino student to place first in the annual competition, although two El Camino College students have placed in the top three places in the past. Jerry Buchholz, now a graduate student of the University of California at Berkeley, tied for second place in 1957; and Jerry Hakanson, now a

At the presentation ceremony Johnson also received a \$50 cash award from an anonymous donor, recognizing him as the outstanding general chemistry 1A-B student for 1960-61. A year ago the award was won by Jeffrey King of the college science department.

Heavy Demand For Nurses

The heavy demand for qualified nurses to fill positions in the Air Force Nurse Corps has prompted the Air Force to continue offering Commissions to male nurses.

Master Sergeant James P. LeFevre, local Air Force recruiting representative explained that male nurses over 20 but less than 35 years of age are eligible to apply for an Air Force commission. In cases where the applicant has had prior military service, the age limit is extended to 39 years of age. Marriage is not a bar to application.

Qualified applicants are commissioned as Air Force officers in grades commensurate with their age, education and professional experience and enter active duty in their commissioned grade. The minimum tour of active duty is three years.
