## County Approves Streets for Two Carson Tracts

"Recent street improvements in Carson just completed by the subdivider, have been accepted as county highways by the Board of Supervisors," Supervisor Burton W. Chace disclosed this week.

Improvements, serving 308 homesites in the new development on 190th St. east of Avalon Blvd., include the construction of pavement, curb and gutter, drainage structures and sidewalks.

Supervisor Chace added that the improvements, adding 4.4 miles to the county system of maintained highways, were constructed by the developer under the supervision of the Los Angeles County Road Department at an approximate cost of \$397,400.

In a second announcement Chace disclosed that the road department has approved plans and specifications for the construction of streets in a new subdivision at Avalon Blvd and 220th St.

According to the supervisor, proposed work will include excavation, grading, paving, and the construction of sidewalks, drainage structures, curbs and gutters.

## Supervisors Ask Study On Cause of Flooding

Supervisor Kenneth Hahn Friday asked for a full investigation by County Flood Control officials as to the cause of flooding of the Torrance area, following Thursday's storm, which dumped nearly 5 inches (4.94) on the community, to overflow its banks between Normandie and Vermont.

Supervisor Hahn personally visited the stricken area Thursday night in a U.S. Army "Duck" with Gardena Mayor Harvey Chapman and followed up with a second inspection tour Friday morning with the mayor and M. E. Salisbury, chief engineer, County Flood Control District.

On the Thursday evening tour, they counted 31 automobiles under water on Artesia between Vermont and Western avenues. They also visited the evacuee center in the Gardena City Hall and talked to the residents who had been removed from their homes.

"The city officials of Gardena, the Red Cross and the Kiwanis Club should be commended from their response to this emergency," Supervisor Hahn declared.

**'56 FLOOD**  
Following a 1955 flood, which inundated a much larger area, Supervisor Hahn inspected the area with H. E. Hedger, then chief engineer of the Flood Control District, and requested that plans for the permanent improvement of Dominguez channel be speeded up.

This action marked the start of a multi-phase program, estimated to cost a total of \$19,000,000 and which will ultimately require construction of 25 new bridges.

Since that time, a total of \$7,248,115 has been spent on five units of the improvement program in Supervisor Hahn's district, with crews working on the section between Compton Blvd. and Rosecrans Ave.

Units completed to date in the district are: Vermont to Denker, \$2,048,700; Denker and Gramercy, \$1,123,026; Gramercy
