

Select Architects for Harbor College Project

Architects to design preliminary and working drawings and specifications for the \$2,700,000 fourth phase of construction at Harbor College in Wilmington were announced this week by Superintendent of Schools Jack P. Crowther.

Firms of A. C. Zimmerman and F. D. Howell have been selected to design the blueprints for the project which will complete the fourth phase multimillion dollar construction program, which will make Harbor College one of the most modern junior colleges in the state.

Firm will have 30 days to bring preliminary drawings up to date and then will have 200 days for completion of working drawings and specifications.

Fourth phase includes classrooms buildings for the social sciences, art, engineering and technical, and music departments, a drama building, extensive site grading, 4000 additional bleachers for the college's athletic field, athletic courts, and alterations to the cafeteria and graphic arts building.

Total cost of the new buildings is estimated at \$2,538,000 and alterations and improvements are expected to cost approximately \$162,000.

Funds for the \$2,700,000 fourth phase will be sought in the 1962 school bond building program, which is scheduled to be on the June 5 ballot, the superintendent said.

Harbor Hospital's Eight Storey Facility Will Be Ready in October

Completion of the new eight-story Harbor General Hospital by late October of this year was predicted this week by County Supervisor Burton W. Chace.

Chace made the disclosure at the Board of Supervisors accepted the recently completed laundry and heating plant which will serve the hospital plant and related buildings.

In 1956, Supervisor Chace recognized the need for a new hospital and through the efforts of a citizens committee headed by Torrance businessman Sam Levy, a bond issue was successfully presented to the voters of Los Angeles County to finance the new hospital and out-patient clinic.

Utility building was built at a cost of \$1,680,000, including the cost of the laundry machinery and equipment. The rising patient load compelled the hospital management to put the laundry into use last November, before completion of the building.

According to Alfred L. Thomas, Administrator of Harbor General, the laundry has proven to be "very efficient, its design taking full advantage of the latest type of laundry equipment and conveyors."

New hospital will have a maximum bed capacity of 660. Although this does not greatly exceed the present capacities of the old hospital, more adequate radiology facilities and laboratories will expedite the diagnosis and treatment of patients, resulting in shorter average hospital stays, making more beds available to acutely ill citizens.
