'There Shall be no Night' Soon To be Presented by Methodists

Torrance resident, Donald Wykes, 22620 Gaycrest Ave., has an important role in Robert Sherwood's famed drama "There Shall Be No Night" which will be revived by the Plymouth Players of Wilshire Methodist Church for three nights starting Feb. 23.

Sherwood's play was first produced in 1940 and dealt with the invasion of Finland by its giant neighbor, Russia. "That it has a message for our time goes without saying" according to the play's director, Glen E. Turner.

The semi-pro cast includes Harry Kner and Jacquelin Kurasch in the roles originally made famous by Alfred Lunt and his wife Lynn Fontanne.

INSPIRATION
Robert Sherwood, author of this play, was inspired by a 1939 broadcast from Helsinki to put his convictions concerning the betrayal of Finland into dramatic form.

Brotherhood Emphasized In Sunday Sermon

Brotherhood will be emphasized in the Lesson-Sermon entitled "Mind" in all Christian Science churches on Sunday. University Players Performance Slated

The California Western University Players will present the provocative religious drama "Between Two Thieves" at Torrance First Methodist Church, March 24. The drama group from the San Diego university is touring Southern California churches with the religious production.

The play, offering a modern interpretation of the Crucifixion, attempts to answer the age-old question "Who is Guilty?" A group of Jewish Wanderers improvise onstage the drama they claim "has been staged every night since the Crucifixion of Christ."

ADAPTATION
The university production is taken from Warner LeRoy's Off-Broadway adaptation, which "New York Times" critic Brooks Atkinson called "a theatrical miracle." The play was originally "Processo a Gesu" written by Italian Diego Fabbri. Since Fabbri's original staging in 1955, France has given 900 productions of the classic.

The players are offering the tour as a California Western University service to seven Southern California churches.

Elder Taylor left his career as a prominent Provo, Utah, business executive to become president of the California Mission in 1955. He was called to his present position in 1958. He is now managing director of the church's famed welfare program.

Saturday evening, special leadership and parent-and-youth meetings will be held.

BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH
Elder Henry D. Taylor became an Assistant to the Council of Twelve Apostles of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints on April 10, 1958, climaxing 35 years of devoted church leadership.

In 1959, Elder Taylor was named managing director of the general church welfare committee, supervising church-wide projects for the production, processing, stor-

age and distribution of food, clothing and other commodities to assist church members.

In August, 1955, he left his position as an executive in a home furnishings business in Central Utah to serve a term as president of the church's California Mission. Three years later, he received his present assignment.

Taylor was born November 22, 1903, in Provo, Utah, a son of Arthur N. and Maria Dixon Taylor. He was graduated from public schools and Brigham Young University in Provo, Utah, and received

a master's degree in retailing from New York University in 1937.

FAMILY BEGUN
He married Alta Hansen of Richfield, Utah, December 26, 1929, in the Salt Lake Temple. They are the parents of four sons.

As a youth he was a leader of priesthood quorums, and was called to serve as a missionary in the Eastern States from 1924-26, where he served as Connecticut conference president and later as mission secretary.

His church assignments have also included president of a Seventy's quorum, member of the Sharon Stake high council, Sharon Stake clerk, bishop of Pleasant View Ward, and he was president of the Sharon and East Sharon Stakes for 10 years.

In addition, he was chairman of the Central Utah and Mt. Timpanogos regions of the Church Welfare Program.

Elder Taylor has also held prominent civic positions, including vice-president and executive committee chairman of Utah Valley Hospital, and member and past president of both the Provo Chamber of Commerce and the Provo Kiwanis Club.
