South Bay Psychologist Lectures to Parents

Torrance Cooperative Nursery School welcomes Dr. Leonard A. Cole, South Bay psychologist, Monday evening, March 19, at 7:30 p. m. in the third of his talks on child psychology, to the parent membership and guests at the school, 4558 West 182nd St.

Theming his talks on two important concepts: child's need to trust and the parent's need to combine discipline and understanding in the child's best interest, Dr. Cole has been examining the major problems arising from day-to-day parent-child contacts. Such matters as childhood fears, hostilities and

sibling rivalries have been under scrutiny. In his third talk he will consider steps in the child's psychological development. A question and answer period will follow the talk, encouraging the nursery group to further explore matters of special interest.

Torrance Nursery School, whose membership includes families from the entire South Bay area, provides a four day a week morning program for pre-schoolers. 


