EXISTING LIGHT

In light-colored rooms with several windows, existing illumination can provide the light needed for taking pictures of such interiors. County Accepts Easement for Torrance Drain

Acquisition of an easement on 7,870 square feet of Southern California Edison Company land in Torrance was approved yesterday to expedite work on a major drain project serving the Torrance area, Supervisor Kenneth Hahn announced.

Easement is for a 12 foot wide strip of land which generally follows a small ditch in the McDonald Tract near 179th St. and Glenburn Ave.

Work on Flood Control Project 586 is in progress under a contract let in August, 1951, Supervisor Hahn said.

The M & J Construction Company and Vinson Construction Company are contractors in a joint-venture for the four-segment project which runs through portions of Torrance, Redondo Beach and unincorporated County territory.

TORRANCE DRAIN

Line A of the Torrance drain is being built south on Glenburn Ave. from an existing drain a short distance south of Artesia Blvd. It will be extended south on 182nd St. and then west to Prairie Ave. and is designed to eliminate severe flooding of 182nd St. which occurs during every heavy rain, Supervisor Hahn said.

Line B starts at Dominguez channel and Crenshaw Blvd. and extends north on Crenshaw to Redond Beach Blvd. Completion of this segment will relieve flooding conditions at the intersection of Crenshaw and Redondo Beach Blvds.

Line C begins at Dominguez channel on Crenshaw and extends southerly for 300 feet, then southwest to Elgar Ave. and 168th St., then south on Elgar to 107th St.

Award \$21,000 Contract for School Work

of Schools Jack P. Crowther. The firm of Axton Paint Service was awarded the project and will have 90 calendar days to complete the work. The firm submitted the lowest of 14 bids. The repainting project is part of a continuing maintenance program conducted throughout the district by the school system, Crowther stated. Exteriors of school buildings are painted on the average of once every five years and interiors are painted on the average of once every 12 years.


