Lebanese by birth, Mr. Malki originally came to the United States in 1951, specifically to attend a bible college. Pastor Lowen says. Less than 10 years later he completed a course and graduated from Life Bible College, Los Angeles, Foursquare Bible training center, became a citizen of the United States, and, by 1959, was on his way, with his family, to Lebanon where he established independently a church in Bairut, the capitol of that land north of Israel, said to be approximately the size of the State of Connecticut.

RETURN HOME
Grandson of a Presbyterian minister who was killed in 1914 during a massacre between Moslems and Christians, Malki and his family are scheduled to return in late summer to Lebanon, a country referred to as "The Switzerland of the Middle East."
