Home-ported at San Diego, Calif., the Oriskany completed a five-month overhaul at the San Francisco Naval Shipyard last August and scheduled to begin a seven-month cruise to the Far East in June.

Frederick H. Furnace, aviation structural mechanic airman apprentice, USN, son of E. H. Furnace of 3843 W. Artesia, Torrance, reported for duty, March 5, with Attack Squadron 122 at the Naval Air Station, Moffett Field, Calif. DeFields, who arrived overseas in May 1960, is a draftsman in Headquarters Detachment of the 35th Quartermaster Battalion in Ludwigsburg. He entered the Army in September 1959. DeFields was graduated from Torrance High School in 1959.

Pot Shot was scheduled to include carrier strikes, anti-submarine operations, amphibious landings, replenishment at sea, mine warfare, naval convoy operations, Marine operations ashore and aerial, surface and subsurface reconnaissance.

"The opportunity to bring together all these forces in a single operation is rare," says Vice Adm. Charles L. Melson, commander of the First Fleet and exercise commander. "We hope to considerably enhance the operational readiness and capabilities of all Pacific Fleet units participating."
