Ascension League Chooses Delegates

Prominent matters on the agenda include selection of projects for the coming biennium. Delegates from the 177 societies, representing a membership of 8500, will vote for two mission projects to receive 40 per cent of the biennium's mite box offerings and two to receive 10 per cent.

Under the theme, "For We Are Laborers Together with God," the convention will carry a high inspirational program with Mrs. Walter N. Hoppe of Lakewood, international president, being the main speaker.

Social functions include a fellowship banquet on Saturday night, a Continental breakfast poolside on Sunday morning and a luncheon Sunday noon in the Ramada Room.

As of July, 1961, the Lutheran Women's Missionary League had 202,922 women active in league work, carried on through 4957 societies in 37 districts.

Christian Science Lesson-Sermon Sunday Emphasizes Obedience

The Lesson-Sermon "Everlasting Punishment" in all Christian Science churches on Sunday will emphasize how obedience to divine law brings human redemption.

In a story featured in the Scriptural passages, Jonah's disobedience to God's command to go to Nineveh resulted in his being cast into the sea and swallowed by "a great fish. . . . Then Jonah prayed unto the Lord his God out of the fish's belly. And said, . . . When my soul fainted within me I remembered the Lord and my prayer came in unto thee, into thine holy temple." Then the Lord saved Jonah and said unto him the second time, "Arise, go unto Nineveh, that great city, and preach unto it the preaching that I bid thee. . . . And Jonah began to enter into the city." Then the king said, "Let man and beast be covered with sackcloth, and cry mightily unto

God. . . . And God saw their works, that they turned from their evil way; and God repented of the evil, that he had said that he would do unto them; and he did it not." (Jonah 1-3)

In "Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures" Mary Baker Eddy affirms, "Truth, Life, and Love are the only legitimate and eternal demands on man, and they are spiritual lawgivers, enforcing obedience through divine statutes."

The Golden Text is from Psalms (130), "Let Israel hope in the Lord: for with the Lord there is mercy, and with him is plenteous redemption."
