Gladys Aylward Is Speaker At First Baptist Church Meet

Gladys Aylward, who rose from the position of a London parlormaid to become a legend in her own life-time through heroic service in war-ravaged China, will speak Sunday morning at 9:15 and 10:45 at the First Baptist Church of Torrance, 2118 Carson St., according to a news release issued by Rev. Robert Dehn, acting pastor.

Because of having Miss Aylward as guest Sunday morning, a special service for mothers with special awards will be held at the 7:30 p.m. evangelistic service.

Miss Aylward, known best as "The Small Woman" whose story was condensed in book form by the Reader's Digest and portrayed on the screen in the "Inn of the Sixth Happiness," has arrived in America as guest of World Vision Inc., a national missionary service agency with headquarters in Pasadena, Calif. It is her third speaking tour of North America.

Born in England, the speaker long dreamed of going to China as a missionary, but was unable to obtain backing because of her lack of education. She determined to go anyhow without help from anyone.

In 1930 equipped with railroad tickets, her Bible, nine-pence in coins and two one-pound traveler's checks (less than \$8), Miss Aylward made the "impossible" trans-Siberian trip by rail to the land of China where she eventually became a citizen.

Her life in a remote town of northwest China became a series of dramatic events. She stopped a prison riot alone by calmly facing an ax-wielding inmate, rescued a child from a dealer in human lives, led the district's exalted Mandarin to accept Christianity and saw many other miracles of faith.
