Jester Hairston to Conduct Evening of Negro Spirituals

In the interest of furthering musical culture and enjoyment in the community, the Chancel Choir of the First Christian Church of Torrance, 2930 Eldorado Ave. has invited internationally known Jester Hairston to conduct an evening of Negro spirituals. The program will take place at 7:30 p.m. on May 25. The public is invited.

The choir of 35 members will sing twelve spirituals under Hairston's direction, all of which have been arranged by him. Among the selections are "I Can Tell the World," "Wade in the Water," and "Great God Almighty."

Jester Hairston is a graduate of Tufts University in Boston where he majored in music. He also attended the Juilliard Conservatory of Music in New York. He has trained many choirs for Broadway musicals and radio productions, as well as acting as assistant director of the famous Hall Johnson Choir.

Since organizing his own choir in 1943 in the Los Angeles area, he has arranged and conducted the choral background music for "Duel in the Sun," "Portrait of Jenny," "Carmen Jones" and many other outstanding films. Hairston has played many character roles in both television and motion pictures among them "The Alamo," "Summer and Smoke," and will appear soon in "To Kill A Mockingbird."

He also played the role of "Leroy" in the Amos 'n' Andy show for sixteen years. He has just returned from a European good will tour for the state department where he conducted choirs in American Folk songs in Germany, Austria, Switzerland and Norway.
