Ron Wright, who recently scored a hit in "Goodbye Charlie," and who is a favorite of local audiences, plays the part of Larry Larkin, and extremely egotistical comic strip cartoonist. He plans to honeymoon with his starry-eyed secretary Dunreath Henry, (played by Don's real life fiancée, Christine Bernard.)

They decide to hire a ghost artist to do the cartoons while they are away. Along comes Francis X. Digman, played by personable young Bob Lohbauer, who, in the course of taking over the cartoon strip, proceeds to take over Larry's girl.

To add to the hilarious antics, there is Norman, an adopted son, played by a brilliant little actor named Bob Riley. He steals scenes as he charges about, upsetting Larry's well-ordered life with Indian wigwams and smoke signals in the living room. Popping in and out at various times, the other members of the cast add their contribution to a fast-paced, well-directed show.
