Adventists Place Signatures on Huge Scroll

David deWaal, 5089 Hallmark, Arlington, temperance director of Torrance Seventh-Day Adventist Church, today announced that local signatures of a world-wide campaign to effect greater moral responsibility in everyday life have been placed in a giant scroll set for public exhibit in San Francisco July 26.

"The local signatures, representing members of the 260-member local Adventist church, were attached to a scroll from 84 Southland Adventist churches in Los Angeles, Santa Barbara and Ventura counties at the Adventists' Southern California conference headquarters in Glendale before being sent to Washington, D. C., where they were affixed to the world-wide scroll. This scroll expresses the dedication of more than 1,000,000 persons in 196 countries around the world to high moral principles which view the body as the temple of God and as such believe it should not be violated through any form of intemperance," deWaal stated.

According to the director, the giant scroll will be put on public display at the Adventists' 49th quadrennial world conference being held July 26 through Aug. 4, in San Francisco.

DeWaal said Southland Adventist headquarters has expressed gratitude to the local church congregation for "the dramatic and united way in which your members affirmed themselves toward the upbuilding of a


Parish Carnival Set By Catholic Women
