

### Two Married Couples Get Harbor College Diplomas

Some Harbor College diplomas are coming out in pairs this year labeled Mr. and Mrs. Two married couples, Mr. and Mrs. Kenneth Cooper of Harbor City, and Mr. and Mrs. Wiley Price of Gardena, are among the 131 students to be graduated from Harbor College June 14.

Behind each of the couples is a story.

Marlene and Kenneth Cooper have been three and a half years reaching this graduation but both have built up an impressive record. Mrs. Cooper was a charter member of Euclidean, mathematics club, was a member of Alpha Gamma Sigma, scholarship society, and was on the President's Honor Roll three times. She was a toastmistress at many Harbor functions and a finalist in the Toastmasters' speech contest in 1959.

Cooper has earned his diploma while working as a marine engineer, often putting in a 70 hour week and even squeezing in trips to Hong Kong, Hawaii, Philippine Islands and Japan.

Cooper hopes to be a curator and will major in history with a minor in sculpturing. Mrs. Cooper hopes to obtain a doctorate in education. It is her ambition to be one of the six students admitted each year to the John Tracy clinic where she will receive specialized training to teach deaf children.

The Coopers have a family of three girls, the youngest, Maurine, named after Harbor instructor Dr. Maurine Holwerda.

Kay and Wiley Price will both receive their vocational nursing pins, indicating completion of the vocational nursing course, June 15, at the First Baptist Church

in Torrance. On the 14th they will receive their Associate of Arts degree at the regular student commencement. On August 7 they will take their California State Board examinations to qualify them as licensed vocational nurses. They hope to work together in a local hospital.

In the audience at the graduation ceremony will be Wiley's 83-year old mother, the Wiley's daughter and son-in-law, and their grandchildren, Wiley Wilson 7 and Jayny Wilson 3.

By attending evening classes and summer sessions the Prices completed their AA in three semesters.
