

Vel Milelich Attends Marketing Institute

Vel Milelich of Vel's Ford Sales Co., Torrance dealership, has completed a one-week course in business management at Ford Motor Company's San Francisco Marketing Institute.

The San Francisco Ford Marketing Institute, was established in October, 1961, at Burlingame, Calif., as part of a nation-wide Ford program to offer training in dealership management and selling, and to keep western dealers and their personnel abreast of today's rapidly-changing market.

Since the first Ford Marketing Institute was established in 1959, more than 5,000 dealers and dealership personnel have graduated from Institute courses.

Courses are conducted for dealers, general managers, sales managers, parts managers, service managers, used car managers and salesmen. The courses are based on practices proven successful in the field. Tapes and filmed interviews with successful dealership personnel provide a flow of new ideas to keep the courses up-to-date.

The San Francisco Institute is staffed by six full-time instructors, each a specialist in some area of retail selling and dealership management. Outstanding men from dealerships also take part in panel discussions. Director of the Institute is William J. Blaskovich, a member of the Ford sales organization since 1947.




