Clarification On Crossing Double Center Line

Prohibition against crossing a solid double center line does not extend to those occasions when you must turn left across such a line to enter or leave a driveway, Capt. E. L. Greer, commander of the California Highway Patrol's South Los Angeles area, said.

He offered the clarification because of several recent questions from residents involving turns across a double center line.

"The same is true of a double line in which one side is broken and the other side solid. Even if the solid portion is on your side of the roadway, you may turn left across it to enter or upon leaving a driveway," he said.
