Entering the Air Force in 1942, Major Adams won his pilot's wings and served as a flying instructor in World War II and as a crew member on a B-36 during the Korean War.


Major Adams' residence is in Torrance, where he lives with his wife Doris and three children, Eddie 16, Jerry 10 and Jill 4.
