Junior Achievement Movement Expands in Southwest District

The Junior Achievement movement is being expanded in the Southwest District, to give more teen-agers first-hand experience in the American system of private enterprise.

Recruitment for the increased quota of counseling firms has almost completed, according to Manny Wise, JA's Southwest District manager.

The quota of firms for next year has been increased to 31, Wise disclosed, up from 27, during the eighth year of activity, now coming to a close.

Because a few firms are dropping out of the program, nine new firms are being added. Those accepting so far are: Huston - Fearless, Mobil Oil Co., Farr Co., Aeronca Corp., Wyle Laboratories, and the Nortronics Division of Northrop.

Most of the firms have designated the men who will act as counselors for the individual companies to be formed and operated by boy and girl teen-agers during the next year.

Orientation for the new advisers was provided Wednesday at the Norair Division of Northrop. Those on the program, included Wise, on introduction and purpose, R. L. Allen, manager of operations for MinieapolisHoneywell in Gardena, who is on the JA district council, on "Need for Junior Achievement;" Will Rusch, of McCulloch Corp., on "The Adviser's Viewpoint," and Tom Brazil, of Norair, on "Preparation for Advisers."

Wise, who is the full-time supervisor for the JA movement involving 500 teen-agers from various high schools in the Southwest District of the Los Angeles area, also presented a film on "We're in Business," and will answer questions on "How JA is Put Together."

The JA movement, Allen pointed out, is increasingly meeting the need to explain how the American business system operates, so young people can understand better what is at stake for them, their community, their country and the world.

Recreation Department Opens Areas to Public

Tomorrow the Torrance Recreation Department will open all of its recreational areas to the public. This will include seven parks, 24 playgrounds, the adult center, Victor E. Benstead plunge, Sea Aire Golf course and the arts and crafts center.

Persons participating in organized recreational activities last year totaled 777,277. Not tabulated are picnic groups, many field trips and general park attendance.

The Torrance Recreation Department offers something for everyone. Below is a partial list of activities offered by the Department.

'SWIM BUS' SERVICE
Swimming and life saving at the Victor E. Benstead Plunge. "Swim Bus" pick-up for boys and girls to take them to the plunge, returning them to the pick-up point after their swim.

Camp Clatawa, a mountain camp in the Big Bear Lake area will provide hiking, cook-outs, swimming, overnights, crafts and other camp activities. "Chippewa Pow Wow" Day Camp will teach camping skills.

Sea Aire Golf Course, a nine hole, three par pitch and putt will provide instruction for youth, teenagers and adults. A special feature of the course is the Women's Golf Club.

GYMNASTICS
A gymnastic program for boys and girls is offered at local high schools.

Fencing for teenagers and adults is given at North High School by Lyle La Mont. The club has won a full complement of medals in both men's and women's divisions.

Tennis classes, which will meet twice a week for three weeks, will be open to youngsters, teenagers and adults.

Girl's "Yellow Ribbon" softball, the newest rage, for girls between the ages of 11 and 15, will be played at McMaster and Walteria Parks.

ADULTS' CRAFTS
Crafts for adults will be taught at Sea Aire Park. The summer session will include mosaic techniques and design, rug hooking, knitting, copper enameling and stained glass.

"Fun Thru Music" program for elementary age music students will again be under the direction of Jim Davidson.

Modern dance programs for girls from 6 to 15 will

be directed by Joan Maquire. Boys and girls enrolled in the Creative Arts Workshop will write, build, paint and choreograph for their own production.

YOUTHFUL COOKS
Space age cooks for youths 10 to 15, co-sponsored by the Torrance Recreation Department and the Southern California Edison Company, will teach the culinary arts.

Housewives bowling league for beginners as well as advanced bowlers will meet once a week.

Dog obedience classes at Walteria Park with trainer Roy Smith, will continue to teach basic commands.




