Shawger Takes Director's Job

At request of the Chamber of Commerce, William E.E. Shawger has accepted the position of area director-at-large for the 1962-63 term, according to President Mike Denn.

Shawger has just completed a term on the executive committee of the chamber and was largely instrumental in reorganization of the Torrance Chamber of Commerce which has taken place in the past year. He is a pioneer Torrance industrialist, having moved to Torrance in 1920. In 1945 he formed his own company, California Rubber Products Co., Hawthorne, and moved the two plants to Torrance in 1957.

Shawger has been a Rotarian for the past 17 years and also is a past president of Torrance Kiwanis Club, and is active in Shrine. He has held the positions of chairman of the Industrial Committee, vice-president and president of Torrance Chamber of Commerce.

President Denn stated he is delighted that Shawger has accepted this directorship in order to help continue the chamber's reorganization and new program of work. This appointment completes the chamber's board of directors for the coming fiscal year.
