

## 'Epilepsy Sabbath' Observed in Area

"Epilepsy Sabbath" will be observed this weekend in churches and temples throughout Los Angeles County when ministers, priests, and rabbis will explain to congregations some of the common misconceptions which exist about this neurological disorder.

According to Mrs. Dorothy Corey, chairman of the July fund-raising drive of the Los Angeles County Epilepsy Society, there are some 63,000 epileptic individuals in the county who are victims of economic and social rejection because of the clouds of ignorance and prejudice which still surround this ancient ailment.

"Actually the future is brighter today for epilepsy sufferers than ever before," Mrs. Corey said. "This is because seizure-control is possible through the many recently developed anti-convulsant drugs, all of which were unknown prior to World War II.

"With this medical control, many epileptic persons are immediately employable and can lead completely normal lives. They can go on to realize their full potentials as productive, happy citizens."

Mrs. Corey added that "Epilepsy Sabbath" will do much toward achieving better public attitudes with regard to the rehabilitation of epilepsy patients.
