Council Passes 36 Out of 39 Items on Agenda

Out of an agenda of 39 items last Tuesday, the City Council approved 36, sent one back for review, tabled one and held over a third.

The measure tabled was a request by the Recreation Commission to retain money in the Park and Recreation Facilities Fund and to set aside money for park development.

The commission request came through the Rev. H. M. Sippel, commission chairman.

Council members seemed to be puzzled as to what was the best way of handling the financing of parks, and they wanted more time to study the matter.

The proposal sent back for review concerned the construction of a temporary sign at 3300 W. Carson St. The Merit Outdoor Signs desired to erect a 10 ft. high by 40 ft. long structure showing a rendering of apartment building and giving other information.

Councilman Nick Drake put in the original objection, pointing out that sign was too large and that he would favor it if the size was cut down. The council backed him up.

The hold-over legislation was a proposal by the Civil Service Board requesting \$15 per month for board members.
