Safety Group Asks Drivers To Be Careful

Motorists are asked not to turn the birthday of our Nation today into a doom's day for themselves and others.

As a precaution, the National Safety Council of Greater Los Angeles requests drivers to pay strict attention to avoid road hazards.

A midweek holiday in some respects is more dangerous than a holiday weekend, according to J. T. Blalock, Los Angeles Chapter president.

"There is a tendency to push too hard on the highways because the time for the holiday is limited. Every motorist should remember that time can run out at any moment, if he becomes involved in a traffic accident."

Highest hazards hours on July 4, Blalock said, probably will be those when motorists are rushing to get back home but hazards exist every hour and safe driving is a fulltime job around the clock.

Three out of five holiday accidents involve only one vehicle with more motorists meeting death at their own hands rather than the hands of others.

In the upcoming July 4 holiday, hazards other than those of motoring are multiplied, the Los Angeles Chapter president said, and he urged the exercise of caution by swimmers and members of boating parties.

"Even the sun," Blalock said, "can be dangerous. Watch out for over exposure and particularly if this is your first holiday at the beach this season."
