

### Sally Shops Gain Stores

The Sally Shops, California chain of woman's and children's specialty stores, has just acquired the eight Franklin Stores in California, it was revealed today by a Sally spokesman.

Vice president Max Landsman handled the negotiations for the Franklin Stores Corporation of New York. Ted Zuckerman, Sally president, negotiated on behalf of the California chain.

The Los Angeles law firm of Mitchell, Silberberg and Knupp represented the Sally Shops. The New York law firm of Van Buren Schreiber and Kaplan represented the Franklin Stores. The deal was consummated for both parties by Beverly Hills Management Consultant, Abner Parker.

**REFURNISHING**  
After the Franklin Stores have liquidated their stocks of women's and children's wearing apparel, Sally will spend half a million dollars in completely refurnishing and stocking the stores before each has its grand opening as a new Sally Shop.

According to Zuckerman, the Sally take-over is expected to conform to the following time-table: Huntington Park on about Aug. 1; The May Company Eastland Shopping Center location in West Covina about Aug. 15; The Organge Fair Shopping Center location in Fullerton about Sept. 1. Three San Diego County stores, El Cajon, South Bay Plaza in National City and Pacific Plaza in Pacific Beach, are scheduled for about Sept. 15. The El Centro and Calexico stores in the Imperial Valley are slated for Nov. 1 openings.

Varying in size from five thousand to nine thousand square feet, each store will be completely stocked with new fall merchandise, featuring popular priced nationally advertised fashions. It was estimated that it will take about a week to convert each location into a Sally Shop. The opening of the first of the eight new stores will kick off Sally's "Round-up of Famous Brands" promotion.

Zuckerman disclosed that in addition to the eight Franklin shops, his firm plans on opening five more stores by the end of the year. This will bring the total number of Sally Shops in California to 35.




