# Torrance's Parnelli To Race Here Saturday

A disappointed, but extremely confident young race driver has returned to the familiar surroundings of Southern California—briefly—for the first time since he made auto racing history. He's Torrance's Parnelli Jones, who led the Indianapolis 500 for 75 laps without brakes. He's even more famous as the first, and so far only, driver to knock off a 150 m.p.h. lap at the speedway, a feat he turned in the Agajanian Willard Battery Special. Car owner J. C. Agajanian, also the west's most prominent auto racing promoter, has brought his driver home from the eastern racing campaign long enough to drive a midget at Ascot Park Saturday night. "I'm sure we would have won the race if the brakes had held out," said Parnelli. "The car ran perfectly all the way." He was referring, of course, to his experience at Indianapolis. He jumped out

in front immediately and appeared to open up a comfortable margin with ease. "I never felt pressed," he explained. "Never once did I feel that I had to push it to the edge. But it was a different story without brakes. Brakes actually aren't that important at Indy. Without traffic I could have turned 147 m.p.h. laps all day. But I had to ease off when I got in traffic. It's only necessary to tap them (the brakes) to maneuver through the turns, so I had to back off without them. I had to think about the other drivers... and myself, of course." So, Parnelli is a driver with a head as well as a heavy foot. At least race officials think so. They could have black flagged him off the course when they saw he had no brakes. But they didn't.

## Saturday's Event Features Famous Names in Racing

A unique entry, involving a famous name in auto racing, has been filed for Saturday night's United States Auto Club midget race at Ascot Park in Gardena. The driver is Bobby Unser of Albuquerque, one of the racing Unser brothers, who will drive the half-Chevy Arizona Special. Unser, recent winner of the Pike's Peak championship car hill climb, will challenge Parnelli Jones of Torrance in the unusual four-cylinder midget (one-half V-8 Chevrolet engine).

Racing director J. C. Agajanian also announced several other entries for the race, including Northern Californians Hal Minyard of Fresno and Ken Martin of San Leandro. Two prominent Southland drivers joined the fold. They are veterans Allen Heath of Northridge and Johnny Moorhouse of Santa Ana. More than 40 cars are expected to compete for the 18 available position in the 40-lap main event over the half-mile speedway. Jones, who set an Indianapolis record of 150-plus m.p.h., national champion Jimmy Davies of Monticello, Ind., and such Indy veterans as Dempsey Wilson of Lawndale, Johnnie Tolan of Norwalk and Chuck Hulse of Downey will be watched closely in the competition for fast qualifying time.
