### Community Choir Presents Songfest

Climaxing six weeks of preparation, the Community Choir of El Camino College will present "Songs on a Summer Night" at 8:30 Friday night in the Campus Theater.

Instructor Crist Mikkelsen has issued a general invitation to the community to attend the three-part program without charge.

The program will open with the presentation of three numbers by the entire choir. These will be the "Crucifixus" from "Mass in B minor" by Bach, "Hallelujah, Amen" from "Judas Maccabaeus" by Handel and "How Lovely is Thy Dwelling Place" from "A German Requiem" by Brahms.

**WOMEN'S CHOIR**  
"Life Thine Eyes" from "Elijah" by Mendelssohn, will be performed by the women's choir, to be followed by the full choir's presentation of "Gloria," from "Mass No. 2" by Anton Bruckner.

Concluding the first section of the program will be solo presentations of "Rejoice, oh Judah!" by bass Robert Eades and "If With All Your Hearts" by tenor Madison Taylor.

Featuring folk song music performed by Marise Counsell and spirituals and folk songs arranged by Jester Hairston, the second section of the program will include both solo and choral work. Miss Counsell recently returned from New York, where she appeared in the off-broadway musical review, "Ready or Not," and was featured as a vocalist in noted New York cafes. This summer she is enrolled in classes at El Camino while serving as stage manager of the current show at the Horseshoe Stage Theater in Hollywood.

Hairston, who toured Russia in 1961, was a representative of the State Department, has conducted many South Bay residents in special school and summer camp festival choruses. Four of his spiritual and folk arrangements will be presented by the choir.
